

# ACADEMICS

CCMA offers great opportunities for learning. Our classes are small enough to monitor the needs of each child. Spiritual emphasis is provided through daily Bible class, prayer, memory work, and weekly chapel.

In elementary, our academic training includes a phonics-based reading program, English, history, spelling, science, penmanship, math, literature, physical education, etc. Latin instruction begins in third grade for all elementary students.

At the middle/high school level, our goal is to prepare students for post-secondary education. Our core curriculum includes Bible, English, math, science, history, and foreign language. Latin instruction continues at this level. Other electives such as study skills, cultural literacy, philosophy, technology, apologetics, SAT Prep, and physical education are also made available. Advanced placement (AP) and honor's courses are also available to qualified high school students.

Covenant Christian Ministries Academy is fully accredited by the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) and the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools/Council on Accreditation and School Improvement (SACS CASI).

# ATHLETICS

#### **Middle School/JV Sports**

Students with an interest in sports are encouraged to train/tryout for various team sports. Tryouts are open to students in grades 5th - 10th. Age guidelines are provided based on the athletic conference of the given sport.

#### **Varsity Sports**

Students with an interest in sports are encouraged to train/tryout for various team sports. Tryouts are open to students in grades 8th - 12th. A student can play only one year as a senior. Students repeating their senior year would be ineligible.

#### **Elite Team**

This program was developed for the student with exceptional skills in basketball. Students in grade 10th and above are able to train/tryout for this team. Prospects must show the desire and potential to play this sport at an advanced, competitive level. Athletes who make this team have the potential to progress to Division I or possibly NBA status with development of their skills. Prospects must also possess the ability to effectively handle dual responsibilities due to the rigorous practice and game schedules. The game schedule requires travel on most Fridays and/or Saturdays during the season. This program has opened opportunities for foreign and domestic students.

Note: All sports teams may not be active each year. Presence/absence of the activities listed above is contingent upon number of students trying out and availability of qualified coaching staff.

# ADMISSIONS

(Approximately a 4 to 6 week process)

Student admission is based on interviews with the administration, student achievement, entrance testing, and submission of all fees and forms. In order to complete the admissions process, the academy office must receive the following items from each applicant:



- A non-refundable \$25 application fee
- A non-refundable registration fee (50% refunded if denied)
- A copy of the applicant's school records from the last school attended
- A copy of the applicant's birth certificate
- · A copy of the applicant's social security card
- An updated immunization record (Form 3231)
- A recent head and shoulder photograph

NOTE: Upon acceptance, each student must submit a completed physical form of a recent medical evaluation. (Due October 1st for all new students.)

#### **Application Fee \$25.00**

Admissions packet contains a handbook, application, physical form, uniform vendor booklet, pastor's recommendation, records request, brochure, English, math, administrator and/or counselor recommendation form. The application fee is due when the application packet is purchased. Additional siblings pay only the required registration fee. No additional interview is required. Brochures which provide a general overview of the academy are available at no cost.

#### **Registration Fee** \$600.00

Registration fees are inclusive of securing a spot, textbooks, standardized testing, and athletic fees.

#### **Tuition Payment Options**

Tuition is due in full on June 1st; however, six payment options are available for your convenience. Tuition payment options: annually (1 payment), quarterly (4 equal payments), or bi-annually (2 payments – per semester), monthly (10 payments), bi-weekly (20 payments) or weekly (40 payments). Each installment payment is due on the 1st and considered late after the 3rd of the month. A 20% late fee is assessed to all tuition received after the due date. Automatic bank drafts and credit card payments are available.

# **Textbooks**

#### **Discounts**

Families enrolling multiple students will pay full price for the first student and receive a \$500 discount for each additional child enrolled (contingent upon full participation in the AF Program). This discount does not apply to students receiving GSNS due to additional programming needed to facilitate student success.

Registration fees are required for each student. These fees are the same for all students without a distinction per grade level. An additional \$100.00 fee is assessed to registration fees not paid in full by the July 1st deadline. Registration fees are inclusive of securing a spot, textbooks, standardized testing, and athletic fees. The majority of textbooks are the property of the student and are retained by the owner at the end of the year. Specified hardback texts and cultural literacy readers are retained by the school.


#### **Housing**

Out-of-state students living in the dormitory will pay an **annual boarding fee of \$9,000.00**. This fee is not inclusive of uniforms. Current uniform cost is approximately \$700.00 which includes 1 pair of khaki pants, 1 pair of black pants, 1 white dress shirt, 1 black tie, 2 red jersey knit shirts, 1 black windbreaker, 1 red sweater vest, 1 hoodie, and 1 PE uniform. #### **Required documentation:**

- Completed application
- Birth certificate
- **Passport**
- Visa (FI)
- Previous school records
- **Immunizations**
- Completed physical form
- Pastor's recommendation





#### Categories of students eligible for I-20 issuance:

- 1. Full time attendance as a prospective F-1 nonimmigrant student
- 2. An F-1 transfer student
- 3. An F-1 student advancing to a higher educational level at the same institution
- 4. An out of status student seeking reinstatement

Initial admission requires attendance at the school issuing the I-20. Failure to attend the specified school will result in the loss of your student status and subject you to deportation.

Form I-20 will be forwarded to the INS data processing center at P.O. Box 140, London, Kentucky 40741 for data entry, except when the form is issued to an F-1 student for initial entry or reentry into the United States, or for reinstatement to student status. All applicants must have an address indicating their anticipated place of residence in the US prior to the issuance of an I-20. Form I-20 will not be issued until the required application and registration fees have been paid in conjunction with the required documentation.



# PARENT PARTICIPATION

All parents are expected to be involved in the advancement of the school's program. Attendance at Open House and all Parent Awareness meetings is mandatory. Also, participation in the school's Annual Fund program and all fund raisers initiated by the school (including that of the extracurricular groups) is required. Parents failing to uphold this standard will be assessed a fee of \$400.00 in lieu of meeting attendance. The cost of educating each child is greater than the cost of tuition, hence additional fundraisers are needed to supplement the budget.
